4	Crested Guan	<i>Penelope purpurascens</i>	1	H	Heard only while on the boat around Popa Island

6	Green Ibis	<i>Mesembrinibis cayennensis</i>	5	10	Great views of 10 feeding in a field just outside Robalo. And one seen most evenings from the tower or near the lodge going to roost.
7	Bare-throated Tiger Heron	<i>Tigrisoma mexicanum</i>	1	1	One adult seen on the Snyder Canal before it flew off
8	Boat-billed Heron	<i>Cochlearius cochlearius</i>	1	15	Great views of many birds including several sat on nests on a pond near Chiriquí Grande.
9	Yellow-crowned Night Heron	<i>Nyctanassa violacea</i>	3	2	One immature seen on Boat-billed Heron pond, and 2 adults on Changuinola River
10	Green Heron	<i>Butorides virescens</i>	3	10	One at Almirante, also seen at Popa Island and up to 10 seen on Changuinola River
11	Western Cattle Egret	<i>Bubulcus ibis</i>	3	100	Seen on 3 days with best numbers of 100 on our day trip starting at Robalo. Also many in full breeding colors on Changuinola River
12	Great Blue Heron	<i>Ardea herodias</i>	2	1	One at Robalo and another on Changuinola River
13	Great Egret	<i>Ardea alba</i>	2	3	2 at Robalo and 3 also seen at Snyder Canal and Changuinola
14	Tricolored Heron	<i>Egretta tricolor</i>	1	1	Seen twice in flight on Changuinola River
15	Little Blue Heron	<i>Egretta caerulea</i>	3	10	White immatures and many adults seen with best sightings on Snyder Canal
16	Snowy Egret	<i>Egretta thula</i>	2	50	Lots seen on beach at end of Snyder Canal and many with full sets of plumes
17	Brown Pelican	<i>Pelecanus</i>	5	10	Seen on boat trips anywhere around the islands

18	Magnificent Frigatebird	<i>Fregata magnificens</i>	7	20	Seen lazily drifting around anywhere near water
19	Brown Booby	<i>Sula leucogaster</i>	1	3	Seen in flight and one perched on Buoy in open bay on our Snyder Canal day
20	Neotropic Cormorant	<i>Phalacrocorax brasilianus</i>	1	3	Only seen near beach and on dead tree in Changuinola River
21	Anhinga	<i>Anhinga anhinga</i>	1	1	One seen in flight and then perched in tall tree on Changuinola River
22	Turkey Vulture	<i>Cathartes aura</i>	7	<sup>110,000</sup>	An incredible migration took place starting at Valle Risco with 10,000 birds, and then at our lunch stop near La Gloria we estimated around 100,000 birds flying past in just over an hour. This was a true spectacle of migration and a trip highlight
23	Black Vulture	<i>Coragyps atratus</i>	7	100	Seen in many places throughout the trip
24	Western Osprey	<i>Pandion haliaetus</i>	3	3	One seen on our boat transfer to the lodge, one seen on our boat ride to Green Acres (chocolate island) and 3 seen mixed in with the Turkey Vulture migration
25	Swallow-tailed Kite	<i>Elanoides forficatus</i>	2	400	3 seen flying over near La Fortuna and then an amazing 400+ seen migrating through Valle Risco. Fantastic.
26	Black Hawk-Eagle	<i>Spizaetus tyrannus</i>	1	H	One was heard calling at Valle Risco but not seen
27	Double-toothed Kite	<i>Harpagus bidentatus</i>	3	2	A pair were seen at Green Acres, another pair in flight at Valle Risco and fabulous views of one perched in dead tree for 30 minutes by the lodge tower
28	Plumbeous Kite	<i>Ictinia plumbea</i>	1	20	About 20 were seen mixed in with the Swallow-tailed Kites on migration at Valle Risco
29	Common Black Hawk	<i>Buteogallus anthracinus</i>	4	3	Seen anywhere around the mangroves including beside the lodge, also on Snyder Canal
30	Great Black Hawk	<i>Buteogallus urubitinga</i>	1	2	A pair showed really well in flight at La Fortuna beside the dam
31	Roadside Hawk	<i>Rupornis magnirostris</i>	5	3	Seen on lodge trails, Snyder Canal and several other areas
32	White Hawk	<i>Pseudastur albicollis</i>	2	4	One seen perched at Palo Seco and an amazing show of 4 birds including 2 close in flight at Valle Risco
33	Broad-winged Hawk	<i>Buteo platypterus</i>	4	1	The best were one perched drying wings near La Fortuna and another in flight near tower and one mixed with mass raptor migration at Valle Risco

48	Spotted Sandpiper	<i>Actitis macularius</i>	1	4	All seen on the Snyder Canal boat trip
49	Sanderling	<i>Calidris alba</i>	1	7	A group seen flying past beach at turtle study center from Snyder Canal
50	Laughing Gull	<i>Leucophaeus atricilla</i>	3	20	Seen easily whenever we took a boat trip
51	Royal Tern	<i>Thalasseus maximus</i>	6	80	Seen easily every time we were on a boat. Great close views perched on posts along edge of mangrove
52	Cabot's Tern	<i>Thalasseus acufavidus</i>	2	20	The American Sandwich Tern. We had great views in the dock at Robalo and returning from Snyder canal trip
53	Black Tern	<i>Chlidonias niger</i>	1	1	One in non-breeding plumage sat on pole while coming back by boat from Snyder Canal day
54	Pomarine Jaeger	<i>Stercorarius pomarinus</i>	2	4	One seen from boat returning from Robalo and 4 seen well together sat on sea and then in flight as we returned from Almirante
55	Parasitic Jaeger	<i>Stercorarius parasiticus</i>	2	3	One pale immature seen chasing Royal Terns at Robalo dock and 3 seen all immatures from boat on our return from Snyder Island
56	Rock Dove	<i>Columba livia</i>	4	50	Seen around towns with many at Bocas del Toro.
57	White-crowned Pigeon	<i>Patagioenas leucocephala</i>	3	2	Best views were 2 in the gardens of the lodge
58	Scaled Pigeon	<i>Patagioenas speciosa</i>	1	1	Just one seen from the tower
59	Band-tailed Pigeon	<i>Patagioenas fasciata</i>	1	25	A flock of 25 were seen at La Fortuna
60	Pale-vented Pigeon	<i>Patagioenas cayennensis</i>	7	30	The commonest pigeon and seen just about everyday
61	Short-billed Pigeon	<i>Patagioenas nigrirostris</i>	2	2	Good views had on two days around the lodge
62	Ruddy Ground Dove	<i>Columbina talpacoti</i>	2	6	Seen in small numbers on our two day trips
63	Grey-headed Dove	<i>Leptotila plumbeiceps</i>	2	1	One seen on the trails at the lodge.

70	White-collared Swift	<i>Streptoprocne zonaris</i>	3	20	Several flocks seen on our day trips on the mainland
71	Grey-rumped Swift	<i>Chaetura cinereiventris</i>	2	20	Seen on both our mainland trips
72	Lesser Swallow-tailed Swift	<i>Panyptila cayennensis</i>	3	8	Fabulous good looks at several from the tower at the lodge
73	Band-tailed Barbthroat	<i>Threnetes ruckeri</i>	1	H	One heard singing on the trails around the lodge

81	Rufous-tailed Hummingbird	<i>Amazilia tzacatl</i>	6	4	Most easily seen from the balcony of the lodge

83	Snowy-bellied Hummingbird	<i>Amazilia edward</i>	1	1	Just one seen briefly at our picnic stop by the dam at La Fortuna
